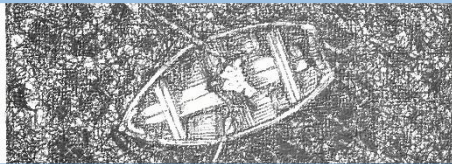


Maths:

At the start of year 5 we will be focussing on 'place value', which means understanding what each digit in a number represents. We will be rounding, ordering and comparing numbers, looking at negative numbers and extending our knowledge of Roman Numerals.

English

This term, we will be exploring the novel 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick. We will delve into a world of a near-future England that has been flooded. Through different text types, the children will explore the character of Zoe and her new friends. Additionally, we will be learning different types of grammar and practise embedding this into their writing.



Computing:

In this unit, children develop their understanding of computer systems and how information is transferred between systems and devices. They explain the input, output, and process aspects of a variety of different real-world systems. Learners discover how information is found on the World Wide Web, through learning how search engines work and what influences searching.

Music:

This term we will be focussing on the composer John Williams. We will listen to his music and consider how it makes us feel.

Topic: Anglo-Saxons

Science: SPACE! A topic that excites and amazes children. The children will investigate the movement of the moon relative to earth and the movement of earth (and other planets) in relation to the Sun. They will explore how the Earth's rotation can explain day and night.

We will learn to introduce ourselves, say how we are feeling and why. Then we move onto school subjects and our preferences.

PSHE/RSE: This term we will be looking at how to use the internet safely. We will also explore the importance of being respectful online.

R.E.

This term, children will explore the belief that adopting a set of rules, or certain behaviour, helps people find real happiness. We will look at the covenant as a relationship of love between God and the people. We will explore other 'rules' such as the Greatest Commandment and Catholic Social Teaching principles. We will gain an insight for how people might make decisions on how they wish to live and become 'more like God.'



History:

Through our topic of The Anglo-Saxons, we will be investigating and comparing different sources; evaluating their usefulness in accurately understanding the time-period. We will look at how the Anglo-Saxons lived and the events that led up to the Battle of Hastings 1066.

Art and Design Technology:

In Art we will be looking at the works of Danish artist Karl Krull whose drawings, paintings and sculptures of figures are inspired by topography, sonar and echolocation. We will create our own pieces of artwork in the style of Karl Krull using line work, printing and the 3D form. The skills we develop will then be used to create Anglo-Saxon style carving out of clay.

P.E:

This term the children will be learning the skills of multi-skills and hockey. We will be looking at the skills required to pass accurately, keep a good defence and scoring. In addition to this, they will be able to use skills in matches and develop their teamwork skills!
